

Training company saves over £4000 by going green

GROUNDWORK Cheshire has helped a training provider in Ellesmere Port to save over £4000.

A free resource efficiency audit of Protocol Skills, carried out by Groundwork advisor Tracey Birch, highlighted ways they could save money and reduce their carbon footprint.

“As an organisation we are always open to new ideas on how to save money and improve our green credentials so when Groundwork contacted us offering a free resource efficiency audit we were happy to see what suggestions they had,” said Nick Biglowe, Protocol Skills operations manager.

By introducing some of Groundwork’s recommendations, including lowering the temperature of the boiler system, and encouraging staff not to leave their PC’s turned on when not in use, the company has had great success leading to savings of almost £4300.

Other measures have also been introduced by the company including a car share scheme and the installation of a water flush system in the company’s toilets that uses less water.
